
What Your Members Want

Members report they would participate in the following activities if offered by their chapters






Conservation is proven in sustaining chapter growth and diversity



Implementation: 4 Key Elements for the Program



Stream Stewardship

- Coordinate Events:
 - Stream Assessment Identified as a key value we can offer
 - Stream Clean ups
 - Restoration Projects
 - Macro counts
 - Water quality monitoring
- Build partnership with other organizations that are already doing what we want to do:
 - Allegheny Cleanways for stream cleanups
 - Penn State Extension Master Watershed Stewards
- Work with Watershed Associations
- Key partners include Western PA Conservancy, Allegheny Conservation district and PA Fish & Boat Stream Restoration team
