The Cumberland Valley chapter of Trout Unlimited is hosting the 30th Rivers Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp in June 2025. Several other states now offer similar camps, but this is the original camp that became the model for the others. While most applicants are from PA, applications are welcome from other states.

The purpose of the camp is to educate students in the importance of coldwater conservation. The selection of students is a vigorous process. By selecting today's high school leaders, it is believed that they will be the leaders of their communities in years to come. It is important for them to recognize the importance of clean water and how it relates to everyday living. The curriculum has been structured to provide the foundation for that education.

Classes include principles of ecology, hydrogeology, wetlands, trout stream entomology, aquatic invertebrates, hydrology, watersheds, the biology of pollution, trout behavior, reptiles and amphibians, acid deposition, the politics of conservation, and the effects of humans on the Chesapeake Bay.

Instructors lead streamside programs to collect aquatic invertebrates, electro-fishing, and conducting field identification of riparian corridors. Sessions include casting, knot tying, fly tying, and advanced fishing. The Camp provides a balance of instructional material and hands-on learning.

The students will also have the opportunity to participate in a conservation project to repair habitat in a stream. This project is designed for the students to complete while they are at camp, so that they can observe firsthand the effects of their efforts.

During the fishing sessions, the students are advised and tutored by ghillies (mentors) comprised of Trout Unlimited members. The angling is conducted on the Yellow Breeches at the campus of Messiah University in Grantham, PA.

Students will stay in the college dorms and eat in the campus dining hall. Messiah University was named one of the 10 most beautiful colleges in the north.


Financial Aid





FACTS ABOUT THE CAMP



- The camp is co-ed for ages 14 to 17.
 It is held on the campus of Messiah University on
- the Yellow Breeches in Grantham, PA.

 Cost is \$550 which includes tuition, room and board. Financial aid is available.
- The students are provided with three meals per day. Meals are cafeteria style with several entrée selections available.
- Classes are also held in the evenings after fishing.
- Campers receive all course materials, books, a camp tee shirt, hat, and flies.
- There are 10 fishing sessions on the Yellow Breeches held prior to breakfast and after dinner each day
- Classes are taught by more than 25 different instructors, all experts in their field.
- Fly fishing equipment is available for loan if needed.

A typical day's activities begin on the stream at daylight with fishing under the supervision of volunteer ghillies who provide personal instruction. Breakfast is served at 8AM. By 9AM students are in the classroom. Noon is lunch time. In addition to the classroom setting, several classes are held streamside with hands-on learning. Some of the time is scheduled for construction of a stream habitat project. Dinner is at 5PM. After dinner is the evening fishing session until dark. There is an evening program and snack followed by lights out at 11PM. This is not rest and relaxation. It is a learning experience for a lifetime.
